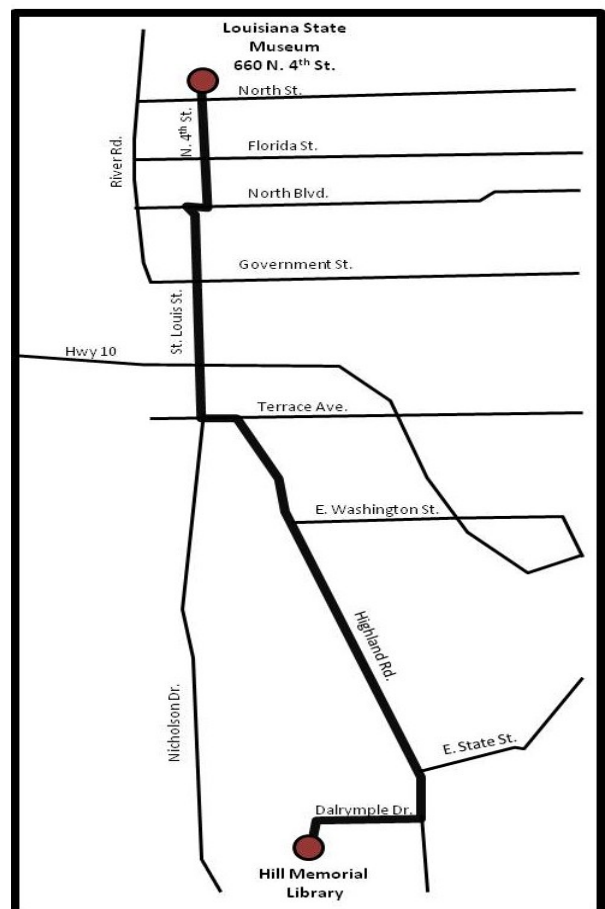

Spanish Town Tour

Join us for a walking tour of Spanish Town, Baton Rouge's oldest neighborhood and the city's first suburb. Established in 1805 for relocated Spanish colonists originally from the Canary Islands, Spanish Town is now both a local historic district and a historic district on the National Register of Historic Places. There is a wide diversity of architecture, quaint streets and alleys. From the 1880s to the 1920s, Louisiana State University was located nearby and many surviving houses were built during this period by University faculty. In recent years, the neighborhood was the birthplace of the Spanish Town Mardi Gras parade which draws thousands each year for its unique and colorful parade. John Sykes, Education Manager for the Louisiana State Museum-Baton Rouge, is a Spanish Town resident and serves as the neighborhood's representative on the city's Historic Preservation Commission.
